

Catholic		A person who followed the Catholic faith led by the Pope in Rome and the main religion of England before Henry VIII.
heir		A person who will inherit the throne when the current King or Queen dies.
monarch		A person who rules over a place, usually a King or Queen.
Protestant		A Christian who protested against the Catholic church and followed the new religion formed by Henry VIII as the Head of the Church.
Reformation		When Henry VIII broke away from the Catholic Church to form Protestantism so that he could divorce.
reign		To rule over a country as a monarch
throne		The position of a King or Queen.
treason		The betrayal of one's country by giving information to its enemies or going to war against it.

1) Rich and Poor Tudors

Tudor clothing was lavish. Wealthy Tudors' clothes would be decorated with gold and jewels. Middle class Tudors' clothes were much plainer and poor Tudors would wear simple, loose fitting cotton clothes.



Food was seen as a sign of wealth. Richer Tudors ate lots of meat such as beef, pork, lamb, rabbit, pheasant, deer, goose, wild boar and pigeon.



Ordinary Tudor houses...

-made from a framework of wooden beams with wattle and daub (sticks and twigs mixed with clay and dung)



Wealthy Tudor houses...

- built from bricks
- tall and ornate chimneys
- lots of windows

2) The Reformation



King Henry VIII wanted the pope to agree to annul his marriage to his first wife, Katherine of Aragon, because he wanted to marry Anne Boleyn. The pope refused this so Henry made a new independent church – The Church of England.

The pope was no longer in charge of everything after he reformation.



Protestant: The name given to the group of Christians who protested against the Catholic Church. Protestants had different beliefs and ways of worshipping to Catholics. There was conflict between Catholics and Protestants.

3) The Spanish Armada

Spain was a very powerful nation and was constantly at odds with Britain. This was often because of religious reasons. Spain was a Catholic country, whereas England remained firmly Protestant.



King Phillip II of Spain was furious at Elizabeth I for the beheading of Mary Queen of Scots in 1587 and formed a plan to attack Britain.

Sir Francis Drake was the first man to circumnavigate the world. He also helped to delay Spain's attack on Britain in Cadiz in 1587. He was Vice-Admiral during the Spanish Armada attack.
